

ARTIST'S SKETCH LOOKING DOWN SOUTH STREET FROM RICE SCHOOL.

In the month of roses is the time we love to wander down South Street near the recently erected group of buildings known as Rippowam Village. For it is here that a small park, belonging to the N. E., N. H. and H. Railroad Company bursts forth into rosy bloom giving an entrance of attraction which would make almost any city feel

proud, while State Street, showing on the left at one time rather an unkempt thoroughfare has now blossomed out with a new road bed and become part of the new route for through traffic. Today nearly every American city is striving for a unique approach from its railroad station, and Stamford has now fallen into line, thanks be to the Railroad Company, some

public spirited citizens, and those who erected the Rippowam Village at the west and the attractive building of the Rice School at the North. In the above view, Mr. Bailey has made his drawing from one of the windows of the Rice School looking down South Street from the corner of State. Summer foliage. While a corner of the beautiful little Station Park appears on the left with its walkways and arches constructed purposely for the avenue of roses which always tell us when Summer time has come. On the horizon may be seen the spire of the new Polish Church as well as the large gas tank and chimney belonging to the Stamford Gas and Electric Company.
